Pastor Scott's Scripts

I first started celebrating Valentine's Day when I was at Pertzsch Elementary School in Onalaska. As a class, we would all exchange Valentine cards with our classmates. A few of our classmates showed their "love" to us by taping an anise sucker from the Sweet Shop to their card. I loved those classmates!

It has been said that "Love is the foundation, the very heart, of the Christian faith." This is beautifully expressed by Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew when an expert of the Law asks, "Which is the greatest commandment in the Law and Jesus answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind and love your neighbor as yourself."

Love God and love others...if we in the church keep these two things as our focus and our priority, we can and will change the world for the better.

As Bruce Ballantine notes, "Toward that end, perhaps one rule of the church is to serve as a rehearsal space where we can learn and practice and fine tune the act of loving others." He then adds a cartoon that pictures a preacher at the pulpit, a deacon sitting behind him with a grumpy expression on his face...he then turns to the congregation and says, "So until next Sunday, remember that God loves you, I love you, and Deacon Al here is working on it."

A couple of weeks ago, our youth choir said it best when they sang, "Love, love, love. That's what it's all about. 'Cause God loves us, we love each other: mother, father, sister, brother. Everybody sing and shout! 'Cause that's what it's all about. It's about love, love, love!"

Tuna or Chicken Packets Ready to Serve Meals (Hormel Completes) Microwave Mac & Cheese Peanut Butter & Jelly Cereal (small boxes are great) Ramen or Dry Soup such as Lipton Noodle Muffin or Pancake Mix (just add water) Individual snacks like granola bars and Poptarts Nuts/Crackers/Popcorn Powdered Milk Stuffing Instant Rice & Pasta Instant Potatoes (bags or small boxes)



** Keep in mind our neighbors using the pantry often don't have additional ingredients to prepare items like Mac & Cheese that require butter and milk so instant options that just need water to prepare or come complete are best.
