#### **Pastor Scott's Scripts:**

On Saturday, September 30<sup>th</sup>, my daughter Annie officially moved to New York City. Ever since Annie was little, she always dreamed of living in the "Big Apple" and enjoying all that it had to offer. Annie will be living right in the heart of Manhattan. I am proud of Annie for taking this leap of faith and for not being afraid to make her dream a reality.

When I was in seminary pondering my future in the ministry, I was asked my ministry hope. I shared that I wanted to be a small church pastor in a small town or city. For the first nine years of my ministry, I served a small church in a rural community and loved every minute of it. For the last 23 years, I have served the "Small Church with a Big Heart" here on the far north end of La Crosse. I never have dreamed, hoped, or even wanted to be a big church pastor, always preferring the family style church where everybody knows and loves and cares for each other.

I share this to remind us that even in a relationship as strong as I share with my daughter Annie, people have different hopes, different aspirations, different needs, different gifts, and different dreams. And that is okay. God made us different. In Corinthians, Paul writes, "Now you are the body of Christ and each one of you is a part of it". We all have different gifts and different ways of expressing and living our faith. Paul says that the most excellent way to be the church is to love others and to respect our differences. That is what World Communion Sunday is all about and it is what the church is called to be. A group of faith-filled people sharing their unique gifts from their unique perspective.

Annie and I have different needs, from a where we live perspective, but we love each other enough to let each other dare to dream and to live our chosen lives as God has called us. I'm a small-town guy. Annie is a big city girl. But most of all, we are family, and we love each other enough to respect the fact that we are different. A great lesson for the church to learn and practice.

The Women's Fellowship Group met in September for a delicious lunch and planning meeting.


