Pastor Scott's Scripts:

Later this month I will make my annual trek to the "Beer Cave" in Onalaska to film my virtual Easter service from the "Empty Tomb". I want to thank Karen Weis and Mark Weis for the original idea to take my virtual Easter service on location to the cave and for their inspiration to continue to take my virtual services to different locations.

The resurrection is the central theme to our Christian faith. We profess in the resurrection of Jesus, and we pledge to live as resurrected people. But do we really know what that means? Do we fully grasp what it means to live as Easter people?

In the song "Live to Rise" we hear: "Like the sun we will live to rise. Like the sun we will live to die. And then ignite again. Like the sun we will live to rise."

In this season of Lent, we have witnessed how Jesus has suffered when friends and authorities looked at him with cruel eyes. Some of those eyes were murderous, some were lying, some were mocking, some were denying. Jesus' journey to the cross has its fair share of cruelty and suffering. In her book "God in Pain", Barbara Brown Taylor writes, "Christianity is the only world religion that addresses a God who suffers. It is not always popular. We prefer a God who prevents suffering; a God who wins. As Neil Ellis points out, "what the cross teaches us is not the power to force human choice and end human pain. It is instead the power to pick up the shattered pieces and make something holy out of them."

The people came to the tomb shattered by the death of Jesus. They came to mourn his loss. What they found was an empty tomb. Jesus is risen...He is risen indeed! From the moment they realized Jesus was alive, again, they lived as resurrection people. Their lives and their hopes were restored. Much like Mary and Peter and the others, we, too, must move forward. We must run from the Easter tomb transformed by the resurrection to leap forward into a new life.

Because like the sun, we will live to rise. We will ignite again. We will live to rise. Jesus has transformed our hopes. Let us then live as transformed and resurrected people.
